1.	Apologies for Absence Apologies for absence were received from Cllr J Atkinson, Cllr R S Fleming, Cllr W P Hillary, Cllr J P Hillary, Cllr P Kjenstad, Mrs K Clark, Mrs S Bainbridge, Mrs C Benson, Mr K Robson, Mr M Rowcroft, Mr D Sutton-Lloyd, Mrs E French, Mr John Snowball	
2.	Declarations of Interest There were no declarations of interest.	
3.	Notes of the Previous Meeting The notes of the previous meetings were confirmed as correct records, although it was noted that the Retail Thematic Group notes should be amended to reflect that the meeting was held on Monday 24 August 2015, not Thursday 24 August. These will be amended.	
4.	Your Issues, Our Proposals Update This consultation was ongoing, with 125 responses to date and the closing date being Monday 16 November. Although the response rate had been rather low, despite the questionnaire being available from a number of venues throughout the parish, in addition to online, it was anticipated that this reflected public satisfaction with the proposals put forward in the document. Work would begin shortly to analyse the results.	
5.	Neighbourhood Plan Front Cover A range of designs for the front cover and supporting documents of the Neighbourhood Plan was displayed for	

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	consideration. After discussion, it was agreed to use	
	sample number 1 for the front cover and number 22 for the	
	supporting documents.	
6.	Character and Heritage Assessment	
	A draft version of this document had been received and a	
	number of amendments made. It was noted that the	
	typescript was extremely small and difficult to read. This	
	had been repeatedly drawn to the attention of the	
	consultants who had produced the document and they had	
	been requested to increase the pitch size. It was noted	
	that the document had been funded by a grant from	
	Communities and would be audited by this organisation.	
	Unfortunately, we therefore had only a limited amount of	
	control over the appearance of the document. It was	
	suggested that the local MP may be able to assist if there	
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7	were any major issues.	
7.	Neighbourhood Plan Project Update	
	Progress was being made on writing a number of required	
	sections of the Plan. However, some delays were being	
	experienced while information or guidance was awaited	
	from Durham County Council, for instance the	
	Sustainability and Impact Assessment could not be	
	completed by DCC planners until January or February next	
	year.	
	In addition, a number of tasks remained unfinished, such	
	as mapping all of the green spaces, although this is now	
	nearly finished. It was also noted that there are some	
	10,000 comments received from the public to be	
	incorporated into the Plan in some format, advice on how	
	to do this was awaited from DCC. A new project timetable	
	had been produced, indicating key changes, with the	
	forecast finish date being moved from 25 May to 16 June	
	2016.	
8.	Low Copelaw Housing Site	
<u> </u>	A letter had been received from Barton Willmore,	
	requesting support in the Neighbourhood Plan for the	
	development of the Low Copelaw site. This site had	
	already been identified for development in the County Plan	
	and the GANP will include a paragraph of support to	
	endorse this.	
	At the County Neighbourhood Plan meeting last week a	
	number of smaller parishes were dismayed that they were	
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	being hit with a number of planning applications for houses	
	on any available site. Developers were taking advantage	
	of the 'pause' in the County Durham Plan.	
	As there is a pause in the County Durham Plan it would be	
	prudent to include paragraphs in the GANP in support of	
	the proposed housing and employment land allocations.	

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	This would hopefully lessen any speculative housing development applications elsewhere such as the greens. It would also give us greater control over the supplementary planning guidance for the site so we can deliver a site that reflects the character of Newton Aycliffe.
