1. Find savings.

5. I would like to see a major overhaul in the management and events at the Oak Leaf as I feel it could be a lot more cost effective if run differently.
6. I think considering DCC offered no relief at all in 2020 for people and still redundant you should be decreasing council tax. Tax payers paid more in 2020 for less services.
7. Selling redundant machinery and equipment by sealed bids is not getting the best price. These items should have been professionally auctioned in machinery auctions to achieve best value for money for the tax payer. We also have too many councillors, the council could still easily operate on 2/3rds of the current councillors. This would give further significant savings.
8. We pay that price per month.. And so far I don't feel like its money worth spent. Especially with covid going on. All the councillors want to do is line their pockets with our hard earned cash. £50k pay and annual increases? For what? Doing sod all. None of them are worth the wages they are on. That's why they don't have any budget

9. Provision of 3G/4G pitches for the local football clubs and the wider community to be able to use. Money that could come straight back into the town if we have the pitches to hire.
10. 3g pitch investment for local football clubs to share NAJFC and NAYFC. Revenue would be recoverable at £30 per hour. Payback would be achieved on 2 x 11 a side pitches in 3 to 4 years.
