




### St. Oswald's Pre School



This term we have welcomed back our children and also welcomed our new starters to the Pre -school and Tots in the Park.




This term has also seen many baking activities with the children learning new skills and creating new dishes to enhance those taste buds and share what they have made with their peers.

### Improvements to Aycliffe Village play area

Great Aycliffe Town Council has recently completed a footpath project to improve access to the children's play area at Aycliffe Village, at the request of Aycliffe Village Residents Association. The new access footpaths will allow greater use of the facilities throughout the year and also provide disabled access. The project was completed with £24,600 funding provided by the Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership (AAP).

The tarmac paths have been designed to allow access from the three corners of the site from Millfield, Monks End and the rear of Atkinson Gardens to the play area and the basketball area.

The Mayor of Great Aycliffe commented 'The site is in a natural hollow and tends to get very waterlogged during wet weather which resulted in the play area being inaccessible to some. The new paths will allow access throughout the year and means the play area which was redeveloped a few years ago at considerable expense by the Town Council can be used to its full potential'.

Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership spokesman, Brian Riley (GAMP Coordinator) confirmed, "This is an excellent



project which was identified by the local community and is a fantastic example of a project which GAMP has funded to improve the lives of local residents in partnership with Great Aycliffe Town Council".

### 2022/23 Town Council Budget

The Town Council has recently set its Revenue and Capital Budget for the 2022/23 financial year.

Clearly the budget that we set is important to our local community, both in terms of how our spending plans may impact on the provision of services and investment in assets for the benefit of the town, and in terms of the level of Council Tax that we need to raise from local taxpayers in order to fund these plans.

The Council has set a 2022/23 Revenue Budget that protects and maintains all services to current standards next year, whilst putting additional resources in place to support the development of new and improved community events.

The Council is also maintaining some surplus resources within the budget which will allow it to continue to replenish its balances and reserves. This will help ensure that we can continue to make capital investment

in community assets such as our cemeteries, allotments, parks and play areas, for the benefit of the community. in the coming years.

The Council has agreed a 2022/23 Capital Programme Budget of £280,600, with the budget focused on essential investment linked to the delivery of the Council's Asset Management Plan.

Planned investment includes building maintenance works, replacement works machinery including electrical alternatives, replacement works vehicles, drainage and repair of West Park Lakes, play area surfacing replacement, footpath repairs and Ash Die Back Disease tree removal works. In approving the 2022/23 Revenue and Capital Budget, the Council has agreed to raise the Town Council proportion of the Council Tax bill by 1.99% next year. This would increase the Town Council element of the Council Tax bill by £3.32 per year for the vast majority of local



taxpayers i.e. those living in Band A properties.

The Council appreciates that any increase in the monthly outgoings of our local taxpayers will not be popular. However, we hope taxpayers will agree that a monthly increase of 28p is a small price to pay to ensure that all the services provided by the Town Council can be protected for another year, and that reserves can continue to be replenished, with the added benefit of further investment in new and improved community events next year.
