Town Council 2023/24 Budget Setting Update

It seems that everywhere we look these days there are price rises and pressures on our daily budgets - fuel, gas, electricity, food, insurance are just a few areas where we are seeing what seems like constant increases in costs. These increases affect all of us - individuals, families, community groups, businesses, and public bodies are all feeling the pinch and trying to make savings wherever possible.

The Town Council is no different and is facing a substantial financial challenge of its own in order to balance the books both in the current financial year and looking ahead to next year.

The Council is in the early stages of reviewing the impact of the economic difficulties and cost-of-living crisis on our finances ahead of the setting of the 2023/24 Budget. It has seen significant inflationary increases in running costs, staff pay increases and funding cuts, increasing capital investment commitments, as well as a fall in balances and reserves.

The Council is striving to identify and deliver efficiency savings and generate new income whilst at the same time protecting and maintaining all of the facilities, services, and events the residents of Great Aycliffe value so much and trying to keep any required increase in the Town Council element of the Council Tax bill as low as possible.

The Town Council Tax bill is currently £170 per year or £14 per month at Council Band A and nearly 60% of Great Aycliffe residents pay their Council Tax at this rate. This amounts to 12p in every £1 of overall Council Tax paid, with the remaining 88p going to Durham County Council, Police and Fire Authorities.

The Town Council completely understands the financial problems and worries people are facing at this time and is working hard to restrict the required increase to the Town Council Tax next year, whilst at the same time protecting the future financial viability of the Council.

The Council will publish further details of its 2023/24 Budget soon alongside the launch of a Budget Survey to seek the views and priorities of our local residents.


