## **AYCLIFFE 75 CELEBRATIONS**

The 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Newton Aycliffe takes place this year and the Town Council is making plans to celebrate and commemorate the historic occasion.

Newton Aycliffe was designated as a new town in April 1947, but the actual birth of the town has been widely regarded as being 1948.

The key dates in relation to the birth of the town are 28<sup>th</sup> June 1948 which marked the "cutting of the first sod" ahead of the construction of the first houses, and 9<sup>th</sup> November 1948 which was when the keys were handed over to the first resident of the town.

### 2023/24 BUDGET

The Town Council has recently set its Revenue and Capital budget for the 2023/24 financial year.

Clearly the budget that we set is important to our local community, both in terms of how our spending plans may impact on the provision of services and investment in assets for the benefit of the town, and in terms of the level of council tax that we need to raise from local taxpayers in order to fund these plans.

The Council has set a 2023/24 revenue budget that protects and maintains all services to current standards next year.

The Council is also maintaining some surplus resources within the budget which will allow it to continue to replenish its balances and reserves.

This will help ensure that we can continue to make capital investment in community assets such as our cemeteries, allotments, parks and play areas, for the benefit of the community, in the coming years.

The Council has agreed a 2023/24 capital programme budget of £116,500, with the budget focused on essential investment linked to the delivery of the council's asset management plan.

Planned investment includes building maintenance works, replacement works machinery including electrical alternatives, essential computer replacements, play area surfacing replacement, footpath repairs and bus shelter repairs.

In approving the 2023/24 Revenue and Capital budget, the council has agreed to raise the Town Council proportion of the council tax bill by £12.75 per year for the vast majority of local taxpayers i.e. those living in band A properties.

The council appreciates that any increase in the monthly outgoings of our local taxpayers will not be popular.

However, we hope taxpayers will agree that a monthly increase of £1.06 is a small price to pay to ensure that all the services provided by the town council can be protected for another year, and that reserves can continue to be replenished.

Mayor, Councillor Ken Robson said, "As a resident of Great Aycliffe I can appreciate the dismay caused by an increase in council tax. unfortunately, as a council we would be remiss if we were to utilise our reserves to meet the added strain upon our finances brought on by increased salary rises for staff and increases in energy costs. We feel that the service we provide to the people of Newton Aycliffe is something we are very proud of, and we wish to retain".



# **ENVIRONMENT NEWS**

The Town Council sourced trees, whips and saplings from The Conservation Volunteers and The Woodland Trust.

The trees are funded by private companies as part of a carbon offsetting initiative. These companies include OVO Energy, Sainsbury's, Bank of Scotland and Sofology.

Through these initiatives almost 1500 trees were donated, and every single tree, whip, and sapling was planted in one day! A huge effort from staff and volunteers, who kindly gave up their time to give something back to our green spaces.

Various trees and hedging plants were planted to enhance existing woodland and hedges to help create wildlife corridors linking areas together and providing food and shelter for native birds and wildlife.

Species planted included beech, wild cherry, crab apple, hazel, oak, hawthorn and blackthorn to name a few.

As a nationwide initiative created to mark the Platinum Jubilee, the Queens Green Canopy was due to conclude in December 2022 - the end of the Jubilee year. However, as the official tree planting season in the United Kingdom is from October to March, the initiative is extended to include the full tree planting season, beginning in October 2022 and concluding in March 2023.

All the trees which have been delivered this season as part of the 'I Dig Trees' programme, including ours, will now be added to:


#### The Queen's Green Canopy map
