## **Record of Officer Decision Taken Under Delegated Powers**

### **Title of Officer Taking Decision**

### **Nature of Decision**

12 Months Exclusion from the Town Park, Newton Aycliffe.

### **Date on Which Decision Taken**

16<sup>th</sup> March 2026

### **Reasons for Decision**

**Several incidences of anti-social behaviour to park users, with mud and stones being used as a weapon and thrown at passing vehicles and neighbouring properties**

The decision to exclude [REDACTED], address unknown, Newton Aycliffe (Police to deliver notice) was due incidents in the Town Park where [REDACTED] is accused of anti-social and throwing mud and stones, used as weapons, at passing vehicles and neighbouring properties.

### **Details of Any Alternative Options Considered and Rejected**

Park Patrol Officers have tried to deal with previous matters through restorative justice and educating the youth of actions and consequences, which clearly did not work.

It is considered that any continued unacceptable behaviour in any Town Council park or play area will result in further exclusion as per the Town Council Exclusion Policy.

Bad behaviour if left unchallenged leads to an increase in similar acts and incidents, and possible escalation to spitting, as the young people will feel they can 'get away with it' and there will be no consequences.
